# Did you know...was not from Caswell?

Although not actually from Caswell County, the county was named after Richard Caswell who was the first and fifth Governor of NC.

Come see his portrait at the Richmond-Miles Museum, 15 Main Street, Yanceyvlle, NC and check out the book we have for sale on Richard Caswell too. Richard Caswell (August 3, 1729 – November 10, 1789) was an American politician and lawyer who served as the first and fifth governor of the U.S. state of North Carolina from 1776 to 1780 and from 1785 to 1787. He also served as a senior officer of militia in the Southern theater of the American Revolutionary War. As a delegate to the First Continental Congress, he was a signatory of the 1774 Continental Association.

Caswell was born on August 3, 1729, in Harford County (present-day Baltimore), Maryland; one of eleven children born to Richard and Christian (née Dallam) Caswell. The Caswells moved to New Bern, North Carolina, in 1745. He was appointed deputy surveyor for the province in 1750. Learn more here

#### Historical Location in Yanceyville Will Be the Site for New Senior Living Apartments Coming to Town

The Town of Yanceyville is delighted to announce that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Office of Multifamily Housing Programs has awarded \$143 million to non-profit housing organizations across the country to support the development of new affordable multifamily rental housing in the latest round of its HUD 202 program.

Among those awarded funds was DreamKey Partners in the amount of \$8.1 million for the renovation of the historic Caswell County Training School/Caswell County High School/Dillard Jr. High School building in Yanceyville, NC. DreamKey Partners, a private, nonprofit real estate development and finance corporation based in Charlotte, NC, along with Tonya Haddock, managing partner of Cadence Development and in collaboration with the Dillard Educational and Economic Development Service (DEEDS) Board presented the proposed project to HUD earlier this year. 
